This is a planning session for the Fall Field Days, like we had last year in August. 

Lady Deborah and I attended the International Association of Shrine Yacht Club Mid-Winter Meeting in February. We left home on Wednesday January 31, traveling by bus to Boston, Amtrak to Newark, NJ, then flying direct from Newark to Singapore. After a three-hour layover we boarded a plane for a flight to Bali. We arrived in Bali at 12:05am Saturday morning. It was quite a shock to get off an airconditioned airplane and be greeted by heat and humidity. After clearing

customs and obtaining a tourist Visa, we were able to locate our driver and get taken to our hotel. Finally, at 2:45 we were in our room and the first thing was showers. The next morning, we were able to get a late breakfast and explore the resort. We spent most of Saturday just chilling out.

We had arranged for a driver and car to tour Bali. The driver arrived promptly at 10:00. Driving in Bali is an experience that I did not want to experience, the driver was great in dealing with the abundant motorbikes. There is a ratio of 25 motorbikes to one car. They come at you from all angles, and many have multiple passengers plus cargo. We visited Puseh Batuan Budish open air Temple and then drove out of town and visited Mason Elephant Park & Resort. Along the way we passed numerous rice paddies. The traffic was quite heavy considering that it was a Sunday.

We chilled out for the remainder of our stay at the resort, adjusting to the 12-hour time change and humidity. Wednesday the driver picked us up at 1:30pm and drove us to meet the ship, the Norwegian Jewel, in Benowa only 20 minutes from the resort. This was a benefit since we were able to be first to board the ship. The stateroom was quite nice and with the balcony we would sit outside at night and watch the submarine races.

The ship visited several ports: Surabaya, Indonesia; Semarang, Indonesia: Jakarta, Indonesia; Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia; Singapore, Saigon, Vietnam; and we disembarked in Thailand and bused to Bangkok.

Several of these ports we chose to stay on the ship. In Kuala Lumpur we took a tour which took us to the center of the city, like any city there was lots of traffic and motorbikes everywhere. It was interesting on our drive into the city noting the vast number of new high rise apartment complexes, 20-30 stories high and the first 5-6 stories dedicated to parking. This was something that we observed in many of the other cities.

Singapore was probably the cleanest and most welcoming city that we visited. We visited Singapore Botanical Gardens, which was a former agricultural experimental station that was repurpose into a beautiful intercity park.

After a day at sea we visited Saigon, It is amazing how the city has grown since the end of the war. Again, lots of new high rise apartment complexes. The tour of Saigon took us to Cu Chi tunnel complex. This was the site of the extensive Viet Cong tunnel system built prior to the war and greatly expanded during the war. (A great propaganda site} We also visited a war museum in Saigon depicting the effects of Agent Orange on the rural villagers exposed to AO.

The last place to visit was Bangkok, Thailand, the tour ended at the Bangkok airport and then the long flight home began.
